A children's book about family traditions and making tamales during Christmas time. The story interweaves making mistakes, telling the truth and not covering up which can be used for character development.

Gathering the Sun An Alphabet in Spanish and English by Alma Flor Ada English translation by Rosa Zubizarreta, Illustrations by Simon Silva

This book is a collection of poems in Spanish and English describing farms and harvest in alphabetical order. This is a great book to use beautiful traditional artwork by Simon Silva – asking your child to tell you what the poem is about – predict what might be on the next page. This is great for building and exposing children with their mother tongue or introducing another language.

This story illustrates the circle of life and the love of a mother for her son as he continues through the stages of life. Other topics include love, gender, and roles.

Something Happened In Our Town A Child's Story About Racial Injustice by Marianne Celano, Marietta Collins, and Ann Hazzard, Illustrated by Jennifer Zivoin

This book follows a Black family and a White family as they discuss a police shooting of a Black man. This book provides message of acceptance, empowerment, and positive community support. The book includes notes to parents, grandparents, and caregivers with guidance for addressing racism with children and links to additional online resources for parents and teacher.

Rosa by Nikki Giovanni, Illustrated by Bryan Collier

This book is an illustration of the courageous act and the events that followed. You can re-enact the bus scene with children with you playing the bus driver and being unfair, and have the children begin to speak up for their friend that is being treated unfairly. Discuss other options they can take to bring about change.
